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## **Introduction**

In accordance with Stipulation (H) of *Programmatic Agreement Between Fort Campbell and the Tennessee State Historic Preservation Office Regarding Development, Construction and Operations at Clarksville Base Historic District* (Effective January, 2009), an annual report of all projects and activities carried out by Fort Campbell and reviewed by the Cultural Resource Management Program (CRMP), at Clarksville Base Historic District must be submitted to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP), Installation Management Command-Atlantic Region, and the Tennessee State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). The following report includes a list of projects and activities that have been reviewed for possible effects to historic properties, a determination of those effects, a summary of mitigation and/or treatment measures, and a summary of consultation activities performed by the CRMP between January 2013 and December 2013. This report also includes maps of all areas effected by undertakings.

## **Clarksville Base Historic District**

### *Overview*

*Programmatic Agreement Between Fort Campbell and the Tennessee State Historic Preservation Office Regarding Development, Construction and Operations at Clarksville Base Historic District* (Effective January, 2009) covers undertakings within the boundaries of Clarksville Base Historic District. This programmatic agreement was extended and resigned in December 2013. The CRMP is currently working on a new programmatic agreement for operations at Clarksville Base. Fort Campbell will be contacting the TN SHPO to provide comments and suggestions regarding the development of the new Programmatic Agreement during this one (1) year extension.




Figure 1. Clarksville Base

For management purposes, the CBHD is separated into the Preservation Area and the Development Area (Figure 1). Information on contributing resources in the CBHD are kept on file in the cultural resources database. The district is *Eligible* for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A for its association with the construction and storage of nuclear weapons from the early Cold War.

## Project Review

### *National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Review*

Fort Campbell primarily uses NEPA review as a clearing house for all projects within the installation. A critical part of the NEPA process is reviewing projects for potential effects to historic properties.

### *Record of Environmental Consideration (RECs)*

The Record of Environmental Consideration (REC) is an Army process for internal review of proposed projects in accordance with NEPA. The REC requires multiple disciplines to review projects to determine and comment on potential impacts.

The CRMP reviewed fourteen (14) REC documents specifically concerning the Clarksville Base Historic District. Most frequently, the proposed undertaking is reviewed internally and is modified by the proponent to avoid adverse effects to historic properties.

A list of RECs reviewed by the CRMP is included in this document. Thirteen (13) of the REC documents were reviewed by the CRMP in accordance with the programmatic agreement and were determined to have *No Adverse Effect to Historic Properties*. One (1) REC was forwarded to the TN SHPO in a formal consultation and is detailed below.

#### *Individual Section 106 Consultation*

Under Stipulations E.1 and E.2 of the CBHD programmatic agreement, when undertakings are not exclusively reviewed by Fort Campbell personnel, an individual Section 106 consultation, per 36 CFR 800, with the TN SHPO must be performed before undertaking can proceed. When a Section 106 Consultation is completed, it is forwarded to the SHPO for concurrence with the Army effect determination.

The CRMP completed one (1) Section 106 consultation for and undertaking within Clarksville Base. The Section 106 consultations are entitled *Undertaking Information and Analysis: REC#13-018 160th SOF Warrior Challenge Route*.

### *Tennessee One Call*

The Tennessee One Call is an automated system to serve as a notification for any underground digging that will occur on the installation, in both Tennessee and Kentucky. This automated system notifies callers of any underground utilities buried within the project area. The CRMP receives automated Tennessee One Calls tickets, via email, referencing geographical locations for review for potential impacts to cultural properties. Most Tennessee One Calls are placed for repair and/or maintenance to utility lines and television satellite installation. The CRMP reviewed 3,393 Tennessee One Calls in 2013, over the entire installation. All Tennessee One Calls were determined to have *No Adverse Effect*, only a portion of these were located within CBHD.

### **Archaeological Investigation**

Phase II archaeological evaluations are under contract with Fort Campbell. Evaluations are to be performed by The Louis Berger Group. The project is to evaluate four (4) sites within the boundary of Clarksville Base Historic District. After receiving the draft reports for these surveys, the CRMP will be forwarding to the TN SHPO for comments.

On November 7, 2013 a final report entitled *Phase I Cultural Resources Investigations of 235 Acres at Old Clarksville Base, Fort Campbell (Pritchard 2005)* was forwarded to the TN SHPO office. Comments and site eligibility determinations were received on the draft report in a letter dated December 8, 2005; however, a final report was never submitted. At this time, the CRMP is awaiting concurrence determinations on level of effort in accordance with the Tennessee SHPO Standards and Guidelines for Archaeological Resource Management Studies.

### **Mitigation Materials**

Pursuant to stipulation A of the programmatic agreement, Fort Campbell is to complete mitigation to include public access to detailed descriptions of the history and to illustrations of the buildings and structures that contribute to the District. All mitigation materials were sent to the Department of Energy (DOE) on January 8, 2013 for review of sensitive material. DOE review was forwarded to the CRMP in December 2013. Currently, the CRMP is reviewing DOE comments and will contact the TN SHPO with recommendations regarding dissemination of public materials.

### **Conclusion**

With the pending updates for the Programmatic Agreement and implementation of the ICRMP, the CRMP can foster consistent and appropriate methods for cultural resource management. The CRMP will be coordinating with the TN SHPO on Programmatic Agreement updates. The Fort Campbell Cultural Resource Management Program s hopes for continued improvement and efficiency in the management of cultural properties within the Clarksville Base Historic District.


