REFUSE

- Household type trash, garbage, food waste, NON-RECYCLABLES
- Fort Campbell is regulated as an industrial site. Rules are different than in residential areas

“Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Respond”

REFUSE (GARBAGE/TRASH)

- Per EPA 2010 statistics, the average American generates 4.43 lbs per day
- Total generated at Fort Campbell – 8-10,000 tons per year (*does not include family housing residents*)
- Cost in landfill tipping fees-\$265,000 (+-) @ \$26.00/ton, Recyclables sorted & money returned to Ft. Campbell (*FY 13 recyclables 8409.19 tons*)
- Annual cost for refuse/recycling, including containers-\$11 million dollars

REFUSE COLLECTION

- Refuse/Recycling contract serviced through PMLW/JV
- All refuse & recyclables are transported by contractor to Bi-County Landfill (*except metals, recycled thru DLA*)
- Field generated refuse must be taken to the Recycling Convenience Center for disposal
- ***State Law prohibits refuse being brought on Post from off Post (fine \$5,000.00 per day & up to 1 year jail)***

Containers provided by the Contractor



WHAT CAN NOT GO INTO GARBAGE CONTAINER?

- Hazardous materials/waste and munitions including but not limited to:
- NO unused cases of MRE heaters
- NO smoke munitions (used & unused)
- NO compressed gas cylinders
- NO fluorescent light tubes
- NO pesticides
- NO batteries other than alkaline (A, AA, AAA, C, D, and 9 volt)
- NO aerosol cans-*hazwaste*????
- NO ammunitions (real or blanks)
- NO medical waste
- NO POL, etc.
- NO field trash or off post/housing
- **NO PAPER OR CARDBOARD**
(recyclables)

* Paper & Cardboard recycling is mandatory per Garrison Commander Memorandum



FRH'S: WHERE SHOULD THEY GO???

- SPENT heaters may be disposed of as field trash
 - * *All heaters should be activated**
- Large quantities of un-spent heaters need to be returned to the Dining Facility manager Do not place in dumpsters!
- Excess heaters can be taken to Building 5225 (Desert Storm Ave & Airborne St)

MANDATORY PAPER

Deposit in containers marked for “Mixed Paper” only or...take to the Convenience Center for Recycling

(NO-Photographic, Carbon, or Laminated)

Containers are serviced weekly and must be placed outside the building on scheduled day of service

NO ALUMINUM CANS, PLASTIC BOTTLES, TRASH OR FOOD WASTE ALLOWED IN PAPER CONTAINER

Recycling paper is mandatory on Ft. Campbell

MADATORY RECYCLABLES

*Paper, Cardboard, Tires, Metals,
Wood, Glass, Plastics,
Electronics, Toner/Printer
Cartridges, Batteries, Used Oil,
Phones, Antifreeze, & Solvents*

CARTRIDGES, ALUMINUM/TIN CANS, POV
TIRES (NO RIMS), POV FLUIDS, POV
BATTERIES, & STEEL OR BRASS THAT IS
NOT MILITARY PROPERTY**

ILLEGAL DUMPING

Any solid waste that is not disposed of inside the proper container is considered an illegal dump by TN/KY Regulators

It is against the law and usually a result of “Get Rid Of This”

There are always clues!

PROPER DISPOSAL

Pallets

Must be taken to Convenience Center or DLA (Bldg. 5212) No paperwork required, for recycling/reuse...good usable pallets are sold and proceeds are returned to the installation

Scrap wood must go to the Convenience Center for mulching purposes

These items are NOT to be put in a dumpster



PROPER DISPOSAL

Concertina Wire

Reusable concertina wire is taken to DLA (with 1348) Bldg. 5212

Unusable concertina wire, stakes, and banding (separated from each other and not mixed with other materials) is also delivered directly to DLA (with 1348-1a) Bldg. 5212

Must be in manageable loads. Wire is sold for recycling if it cannot be reissued

Buy Recycled

WOODLAWN LANDFILL

- Directorate of Public Works (DPW) operated & maintained landfill
- Class IV Landfill permitted by the State of Tennessee
- Construction Demolition/Debris accepted only
- Special Waste Permit to handle Asbestos
- Only handles materials generated from construction or demolition on Ft. Campbell

CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

- Construction contractors use Ft. Campbell C&D landfill for construction & demolition debris only
- Contractors pay for their own containers and are responsible for the material that goes inside them
- Do not throw any waste inside their containers

C & D DIVERSION

- ACSIM policy: Divert minimum of 50% of C&D
- Demolition concrete & asphalt is ground and reused as gravel on roads in the training area
- WWII wood buildings sold to deconstruction contractor for reuse



CHECKLIST FOR COMPLIANCE

- Are dumpster plugs in place to prevent leakage?
- Are lids closed to keep rain and vectors out?
- Are cardboard containers used for cardboard only?
- Are recyclables properly segregated from refuse/garbage?
- Is field trash being taken to the Convenience Center for proper disposal?
- Are recycle containers available to recycle paper?
(If not...call 270-798-1279)
- Are wood pallets and misc. wood items turned into the Convenience Center or DLA?
- Is the refuse container being used for Ft. Campbell waste only? **NO liquids, fluorescent tubes, hazardous materials, off-post trash, etc.?**
