Brigadier General Frank W. Tate graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1988 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Aviation Branch. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from West Point in Economics, a Master's Degree from Troy State University in Human Resource Management, a Master's Degree from the Command and General Staff College in Military Art and Science, and a Master's Degree from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces for Science in National Resource Strategy.



BG Tate's command assignments include command of C Troop, 4th Squadron, 17th Cavalry Regiment, 18th Aviation Brigade, XVIII Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg, North Carolina and OPERATIONS SUPPORT DEMOCRACY and UPHOLD DEMOCRACY, Haiti; command of 2d Battalion, 25th Aviation Regiment, 25th Combat Aviation Brigade, 25th Infantry Division (Light), Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii and OPERATIONS ENDURING and IRAQI FREEDOM, Afghanistan and Iraq; and command of 25th Combat Aviation Brigade, 25th Infantry Division (Light), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii and OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM, Afghanistan. In August 2014, BG Tate transitioned to become the Deputy Commanding General (Support) for the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) and in October 2014 he deployed to Monrovia, Liberia in support of Operation United Assistance.

BG Tate's most recent key staff assignment was as the Aviation Division Chief in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-8, from July 2013 to July 2014. His other key staff assignments include Chief, Aviation Systems, Army Aviation Division, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-3/5/7, United States Army, Washington, DC; Operations Officer, 25th Aviation Brigade, 25th Infantry Division (Light), Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii and OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM, Afghanistan; and Chief of Plans, G-3, 25th Infantry Division (Light), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii and OPERATION JOINT GUARD, Bosnia-Herzegovina.
