

SUBJECT: Command Safety Policy

1. As a command, we must be committed 100% to ensuring the well-being and safety of every Soldier, Family member, and Civilian employee that is a valued member of the Screaming Eagle community. We all share a critical role in maintaining the total wellness of our military personnel to include their physical and mental well-being, and personal and Family safety. This is not a duty day task, but involves 24-hour a day, 7-day a week Leadership engagement.
2. My philosophy is simple, establish and enforce standards, identify unsafe practices and conditions, hold personnel accountable for their own actions both on and off duty, and reduce risks by educating the community. There are numerous tools available to assist you in these endeavors. Unit Safety Officers are available to assist you with safety issues within your units, and the Army Combat Readiness and Safety Center maintains an excellent web site that contains risk assessment, training, and other safety related materials (www.safety.army.mil.) The 5-step Composite Risk Assessment process must be integrated into every activity. Safety performance must be included in all Soldiers' and Civilian employees' evaluations.
3. It is imperative that we emphasize safety at all levels starting at the lowest level and continuing upward through the highest level of Leadership. By doing this, we will greatly reduce the potential for avoidable accidents. Remember, everyone is a "Safety Officer"!
4. I charge each of you with taking a proactive role in maintaining a safe working and recreational environment for every Soldier, Family member, and Civilian in the Screaming Eagle family.
