Retiree Appreciation Day 2008

25 October 2008

Bigger and Better than Ever!

If you missed the Retiree Appreciation Day (RAD) last year, you missed a lot! The first RAD in over six years was a huge success with nearly 500 attending on Fort Campbell. The event was kicked off by the 101st Airborne Division Color Guard posting the colors and the pledge of allegiance, followed by the 101st Airborne Division and Fort Campbell Commander, MG Jeffrey Schloesser, providing opening remarks. Guest speaker, Tennessee State Representative Curtis Johnson, provided comments on his support for Soldiers, Retirees, and Fort Campbell. During the day seminars were held by the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS), TRICARE, TRICARE Retiree Dental program and Combat Related Special Compensation (CRSC), outlining changes to benefits and programs. Blanchfield Army Community Hospital (BACH) held a mini-health fair, providing pneumonia vaccinations, blood pressure screenings, and one-on-one preventive health briefings.

RAD 2008

Retiree Appreciation Day 2008 will be held on **25 October 2008** at the Passenger Processing Center (PPC) located at building 7162 on Campbell Army Airfield on Fort Campbell (see insert for

map). The PPC was chosen because of the size of the facility, which has three separate, large rooms. One will be used for the opening ceremony and subsequent seminars, one where supporting organizations will be available for one-on-one questions, and the third for food and drinks.

Registration for the event will begin at 0730; posting of the colors by the Fort Campbell High School Junior ROTC Color Guard and opening ceremonies will begin at 0900. Guest speaker for this year is tentatively scheduled to be LTG Michael D. Rochelle, the Deputy Chief of Staff, Army G-1. Many of you will remember that LTG Rochelle was the 101st Airborne Division G-1 in the early 1990s. After the opening ceremony, seminars will be conducted throughout the day by subject matter experts from DFAS, CRSC, TRICARE, TRICARE Retiree Dental, and others. These seminars will provide critical updates on the programs and any associated changes that have happened in the past year. To ensure the information is available to all, seminars will be conducted in the morning and again in the afternoon.

A mini health fair, conducted by Blanchfield Army Community Hospital, will provide preventive health, dietary, and other valuable information related to your health in addi-

tion to vaccinations. Pneumonia vaccinations will be available and Influenza vaccines should be available for this event (call the RSO as we get closer to the actual event to find out). Height/weight and blood pressure screenings will be conducted as well.

The ID Card section will be open during the event this year. This is a remarkable opportunity to get ID cards issued without the crowds. Note-Only Retirees and Retiree family members will be able to take advantage of this service.

Breakfast will be provided along with coffee and juice and we will have lunch in one of Fort Campbell's outstanding Dining Facilities (DFAC). I received nothing but positive comments about lunch last year at the 4th Brigade "Currahee" DFAC. For those that did not attend last year, this is a chance to see how much better the food is now compared to when you served.

And don't forget the drawings for door prizes! Last year supporters provided over 25 gifts that were given out as door prizes. This year promises to be even better. Don't forget to pick up your ticket when you register. Door prizes will be raffled at 1300.

Many of you don't think a trip to Fort Campbell to attend a Retiree Appreciation Day is worthwhile. Come by this year and let us prove you wrong.

Legislative Update

On 28 January 2008 President Bush signed the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) into law. There are several changes to numerous programs as a result. Here are some highlights of these and other legislative changes:

Survivor Benefit Plan

Paid up Provision— As of 1 October 2008, Retirees that have made 360 premium payments into the SBP, and are at least 70 years of age, will be considered “paid up” for SBP. This is great news for those that qualify now and for Retirees in the future. **Special Survivor Indemnity Allowance**— Survivors that have had their SBP offset by VA Dependency Indemnity compensa-

tion (DIC) will receive a monthly payment in the amount of \$50.00 beginning on 1 October 2008. These payments will increase annually by \$10.00 per month for a maximum total of \$100.00 per month in 2013.

Social Security Offset— The Social Security offset to SBP was completely phased out on 1 April 2008. All survivors will now receive the full 55% of the selected base amount (unless they are receiving DIC).

TRICARE

TRICARE fees remain locked in at current rates until the 2009 NDAA is signed into law.

Concurrent Retirement and Disability Payments (CRDP)

Retirees that are rated at less than 100% but are paid at the 100% level as “Individual Unemployables” will no longer have their payments phased-in. Beginning 1 October 2008, these Retirees will receive their full CRDP payment every month rather than having the amount being phased in through 2013.

Combat Related Special Compensation (CRSC)

Chapter 61 (medical) Retirees are now authorized to apply for and receive CRSC payments. Temporary Early Retirement Authority (TERA) are also allowed to apply for this program.

Services Available from your RSO

The Ft. Campbell Retirement Services Officer (RSO) and Assistant RSO are here to help. Both are retired Soldiers themselves, and have background and experience to either fix an issue or point you to the right place to get it fixed. Last year, both were relatively new in the Retirement Services world. Now they are more experienced and even better trained to assist you with whatever Retirement issues you may have.

Additionally, both are trained and qualified Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) counselors. As such, they understand the nuances of the SBP and can help retirees understand it better. When there are SBP open seasons, the RSO will be the point of contact for retirees to enroll in the program (although open seasons are only offered after legislative changes to SBP). The RSO is ready, willing, and able to assist with SBP questions.

With up-to-date computer systems and software at their disposal, many

changes to the retired pay account can now be done in the office rather than waiting through automated telephone answering systems. While the Defense Finance and Accounting Service has a toll-free telephone number for retirees to make changes to accounts, calling can be problematic. Many simply do not want to sit through the numerous prompts that are required in order to make needed changes. The RSO can easily make changes from his desktop in the office, such as new addresses or bank account information, as well as IRS exemptions and requests to mail an additional IRS Form 1099-R. Of course, the RSO will ask appropriate questions in order to make sure you are who you say you are.

This year both the RSO and assistant RSO became Combat Related Special Compensation Am-

bassadors. They have received special training about the program and how to apply for this program. As laws change and benefits increase or decrease, they are there to help you navigate the sometimes murky waters of disability compensation.

The Retirement Services Office also provides advice and assistance on all other matters pertaining to Army retirement. So don't be a stranger. Feel free to drop by when you are on post, introduce yourself, and meet the RSO and Assistant RSO. Let us know what issues are important to you so we can provide this information to higher echelons in Army Retirement Services. This is an excellent way to effect change. The office is located in building 2577A, the same building where the ID Card office is located. For those who served at Fort Campbell long ago, this building is the old NCO club.

Casualty Assistance-

Preparing for the Inevitable

Although most people would rather not talk about it, the issue of what needs to be done upon a retiree's death is pertinent and should be addressed in order to provide valuable assistance to the survivor. Many times each month, the Retirement Services Office receives calls from grieving survivors who have no idea what to do or where to turn. The Casualty Assistance Center (CAC) and the Retirement Services Office are available to provide support and assistance to the survivor then and in the future.

In the event of a retiree death several actions must be taken as soon as possible. First, the survivor needs to contact the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) at 1-800-269-5170 or 1-800-321-1080 and report the death. You will need the retiree's social security number and the date of death when you call. DFAS will then take steps to close out the pay account to prevent overpayment. If the retiree was

enrolled in the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) or Retired Serviceman's Family Protection Plan (RSFPP), they will take additional steps to initiate pay accounts for eligible survivors. DFAS will also send out paperwork that will need to be filled out and returned.

Next, call the Social Security Administration at 1-800-772-1213, the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) at 1-800-538-9552, and Department of Veterans Affairs (if the retiree was receiving disability compensation) at 1-800-827-1000. Lastly, contact the Ft. Campbell CAC at 270-798-4727/4729/2085. Additionally, the Army Casualty Website at <https://www.hrc.army.mil/site/active/TAGD/CMAOC/cmaoc.htm>, provides valuable information.

The CAC is the primary proponent on Fort Campbell for service-member deaths and are truly subject matter experts. They will provide valuable assistance such as paperwork for pay and benefits, as well as one-on-one, per-

sonal assistance to help survivors through this difficult time. Keep in mind that paperwork for pay and benefits must be accompanied by a certificate of death.

Some retirees handle all of the family finances, keeping this information to themselves. This creates a huge problem upon their death, as the survivor has no idea of what and where bank accounts, life insurance policies, or investments are located. It is a good idea to organize all of this information so that the survivor can easily access these accounts.

Survivors handle this situation differently. Many grieve deeply and have a hard time dealing with the death and the myriad things that have to take place. Take the time to prepare for this traumatic event in order to make it easier for the survivor in this most difficult time.

Survivor Benefit Plan Specifics You Probably Did Not Know

This is just a short reminder that anytime a Retiree has a change in their marital status or the acquisition of a new child the Defense Finance and Accounting Service-Cleveland (DFAS-Cleveland) needs to be informed. While many know there are different categories of elected coverage (Spouse, Spouse and Children, Former Spouse, etc.) it is more important to know that changes to the category of elected coverage are not automatic or retroactive and must be changed by the Retiree. There are also time limits on many elections that if not made on time, will have major effects on Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) coverage. For example, if a Retiree who has SBP coverage for their spouse divorces and continued coverage for the former spouse is desired (or mandated by divorce decree or court order), DFAS must be notified in writing within one year of the divorce. If the one year time

limit is not met there will be no SBP coverage for the former spouse even though the Retiree continues to make SBP payments and it is specified in the court order. What's more, should the Retiree re-marry, the new spouse will have the coverage, not the former spouse.

DFAS always needs to be informed in situations where SBP premiums need to be suspended or stopped. Many times, Retirees do not suspend their coverage after the death of their spouse and continue to pay SBP premiums when the coverage should have been suspended. There have been situations where a Retiree continued to pay SBP premiums for as long as 12 years after the death of a spouse. When a Retiree attempts to recoup some of the premiums, the maximum amount that DFAS will refund is six years worth of premiums. It is absolutely critical to inform DFAS-Cleveland of situations such as these.

If a Retiree elected child coverage upon retirement or had no children at retirement, children can be covered by the SBP later in retirement, provided they are eligible (18 years old or less, or 22 years old or less if in school full time and unmarried). In the case where a new child (or grandchild with custody) joins the family and there was no prior child SBP coverage, a request to provide child SBP coverage must be submitted to DFAS within one year of that child's date of birth or date of custody or no coverage for that child will be provided.

There are many rules and regulations that govern the SBP program and it can be confusing. If you are in doubt or have any questions please contact the Retirements Services Office at 270-798-3310/5280 or drop by for assistance.

ID Card Renewal Locations

There is no need to drive all the way to Fort Campbell to have a new identification card made. Listed below are military posts, bases, and armories where you can go to have a new ID Card made. Please call the organization first to ensure they can assist you and to coordinate what paperwork or documentation will be required. Be advised that many National Guard Armories may not be open every day. Always call first to ensure the organization can assist you when you visit.

Construction Improves Conditions on Fort Campbell for Soldiers, Families, and Retirees

“Growth and development are everywhere, and as always, our planners remain flexible, patient, and committed to providing the best facilities possible to support the troops at Fort Campbell.”

Many changes have occurred at Fort Campbell over the past few years. It seems like you can't drive anywhere on post without seeing some type of construction. The installation master plan is guiding this construction and reflects our commitment to improving conditions for our Soldiers and their Families.

Fort Campbell's Military Construction program is robust, averaging over \$140 million a year since FY04, and should increase in the future. By 2010, Fort Campbell will have been the recipient of over \$1 Billion in new construction projects over the previous ten years.

Here's a quick look at what is happening today:

- Reconstruction of the main entrance, Gate 4, is almost complete at a cost of approximately \$7 million and should be open by the end of June. The project includes five check lanes, all the latest force protection bells and whistles, and additional traffic lanes at the Screaming Eagle/Bastogne Ave. intersection.

- We're developing a complex in the Clarksville Base area near Gate 10 to house the 2nd Brigade Combat Team (BCT). The area includes barracks, company operations, Brigade and Battalion headquarters and motorpools. Other facilities in the immediate vicinity will include a new medical/dental clinic, physical fitness center, chapel and AAFES mini-mall. The total value of this development will be well above \$300 million.

- New facilities are underway for 5th Special Forces (Airborne) Group in the center of post be-

tween Wickham and Tennessee Avenues. Construction of new barracks, a DFAC, a new Group Headquarters and one Battalion HQ/Company Operations facility have been completed in the past two years. By FY10, an additional three Battalion HQ/Company Operations facilities, new motorpools and several specialty buildings such as a new indoor firing range right in the middle of the post will be under construction or completed. This program exceeds \$200 million.

- A new 384 Soldier barracks for the 101 Combat Aviation Brigade (CAB) was completed in April. Also in the project were unit operations facilities for 2/17 Cavalry Squadron, 101 CAB.

- Construction of 360 new barracks spaces for the Sustainment Brigade is nearing completion in the vicinity of Ashau Valley and Air Assault. This continues our program to get our Soldiers out of the old Korean-era Hammerhead barracks.

- A new \$6 million Force Protection Wall is underway starting at Gate 6 and working south along US 41A. This multi-year project will eventually reach Gate 1 and will provide security, privacy and noise attenuation for our Housing areas along the busy highway.

- A 200-child Child Development Center (CDC) near Gate 3 will be completed in August at a cost of approximately \$5 million. This is a reflection of the Army's commitment to Soldiers and Families through the Army Family Covenant and is the first of a number of new CDCs to be constructed at Fort Campbell over

the next few years.

- Under the Army's Residential Communities Initiative, Fort Campbell's Family Housing was turned over to a private contractor and the new partnership is in the midst of a \$300 million, 9 year program to improve on-post housing. Over 600 homes of old Lee Village have been demolished, over 400 new houses have been constructed, and a brand new 500-home neighborhood is underway at Gardner Hills which will include houses for our Command Sergeant Majors and Senior NCOs.

- Defense Commissary Agency has announced their intent to construct a new \$35 million Commissary in FY09. This will increase retail space by over 33% and provide a great compliment to the "Worlds Largest PX." Construction should be complete sometime in 2011.

- Also coming in 2009 will be a new Elementary School in Gardner Hills, a new School Age Service Child Development Center, and facilities for our Warrior Transition Battalion and Soldiers.

Exciting times and opportunities abound for all! Growth and development are everywhere, and as always, our planners remain flexible, patient, and committed to providing the best facilities possible to support the Soldiers, their families, and Retirees at Fort Campbell.

Delta Dental of California announced that the TRICARE Management Activity (TMA) of the Department of Defense awarded the company a new five-year contract to continue to administer the TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP). The TRDP, authorized by Congress as part of the National Defense Authorization Act for fiscal year 1997, offers affordable dental benefits as a voluntary option to the nation's 5 million plus uniformed services retirees and their family members. The new contract becomes effective on 1 October 2008. With current enrollment of over 1 million retirees and family members, the TRDP is already the nation's largest voluntary, all enrollee-paid dental program.

The enhanced TRDP will feature some additional benefits once the new contract is effective, including

certain implant services at 50 percent of allowable charges, an increase to the orthodontic lifetime maximum from \$1,200 to \$1,500 and 80 percent coverage for certain posterior composite restorations.

During the new contract period, the TMA also anticipates authorization to extend the TRDP to new overseas locations, matching as closely as possible the same benefits of the current "enhanced program".

The TRDP will continue as a national, combined fee-for-service/preferred provider program that offers enrollees access to any licensed dentist in all 50 states, plus the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the US Virgin Islands, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Canada. While enrollees may seek care from any licensed dentist in the service area, optimal benefits will be available to those enrolled Retirees and their Fam-

ily members who choose a participating network dentist.

The program still carries a \$50 per person per year deductible, with a family cap of \$150, and an annual maximum of \$1,200 per person, against which preventive and diagnostic services are not counted. Coverage for these services, as well as for basic restorative services, periodontal services, endodontic services, oral surgery and dental emergencies is available immediately on the effective date of coverage. Crowns, bridges, full and partial dentures, certain implant services and orthodontics will be available only after 12 months continuous enrollment, and are payable at 50 percent.

As with the current TRDP, eligible Retirees and their family members can find answers to their questions about the program as well as enroll

East Tennessee Retiree Symposium / Commissary Case Lot Sale

The Fort Campbell Retirement Services Office will conduct a Retiree Symposium in conjunction with the Fort Campbell Commissary's first travelling case lot sale at McGhee Tyson Air National Guard Base in Knoxville. The Case lot sale will be conducted from 2-4 August 2008 from 0900-1600 each day. Savings of 40-60 percent can be found at this sale featuring club packs of popular items and a variety of products including frozen pizza, steaks, ribs, chicken, boneless/skinless chicken breasts, sports drinks, bottled water, soda, pet food, detergents, household cleaning products, paper products and a selection of fresh fruits and vegetables and much more. Also

available for the first time is online special ordering. Retirees can access the Commissary website at www.commissaries.com and click on the link to the left that says "Guard and Reserves onsite sale". The process is quite user friendly. Using this online ordering system will lock-in the items and have them set aside for the Retiree, in a separate area, in the same parking lot as the big tent.
