ENVIRONMENTAL RESTORATION

1. **Purpose and Scope:**

To provide management of installation programs for the identification, investigation, and remediation of hazardous materials contamination associated with past, and current, activities on the installation.

2. **Reference:**

- a. Environmental Restoration, Army (ERA)
- b. Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA).
- c. Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA).

3. **Definitions:** None

4. **General:**

As of Nov. 2003, there were 277 identified sites on the installation requiring Installation Restoration Program (IRP) management. These sites include, CAAF, abandoned sanitary landfills (along Market Garden Road and other locations), battery shops, oil/water separators, oil pits, lube racks, pesticide/ herbicide mixing and storage areas, fire training areas and construction debris burial sites, to name a few. The IRP is scheduled through the year 2034.

5. **Responsibilities:**

Although the EQO will probably not be involved, directly, in the overall management of the IRP, he or she can play a significant role by reporting any known or suspected sites which may have been contaminated by

- a. Routine treatment
- b. Storage or disposal of hazardous wastes
- c. Constituents (including unexploded ordnance).

6. **Instructions:**

- a. There are numerous monitoring wells located on the installation. These wells are to remain locked except when being sampled by designated officials. Unit personnel finding a monitoring well with a missing or broken lock should report the well number (stenciled on the side of the well) to the Environmental Division immediately, 798-9635 or 798-9637.
- b. The map on the following page displays some of the Solid Waste Management Units (SWMU) locations. The SWMU areas, and the access roads leading into and around the SWMUs, are off limits to tactical vehicles.
