Pollution Prevention Operations Center (PPOC) /
Hazardous Material Control Center (HMCC) Operating Procedures

DEFINITIONS.

1. Hazardous Materials. Hazardous material is a broad catch-all phrase for materials that are dangerous if inhaled, ingested, touched or otherwise dangerous to humans or the environment. It includes all OSHA and DOT regulated hazardous materials as well as hazardous wastes regulated by EPA.
2. Environmental Quality Officer (EQO). An individual assigned by a MUC/Brigade Commander, Director or a Battalion Commander. An EQO is the unit/activity environmental coordinator. EQO's are trained to have a working knowledge of environmental issues at Fort Campbell. They assist their Commanders/Directors in operating and maintaining their areas in an environmental responsible manner, training incoming personnel and coordinating any activities, which may impact the environment.
3. HAZMAT Custodian. A unit/activity HAZMAT representative designated by the Commander or Director, responsible for coordination of HAZMAT related operations at the unit level. This individual serves as the first point of contact between the unit/activity and HMCC personnel.
4. War Stockage Level (WSL). A 30-day Unit Basic Load (UBL) of hazardous materials maintained within HMCC at building 5133 that are available for training exercises and deployments.
5. Garrison Stockage Level (GSL). Hazardous materials supported by the HMCC that are available for use while in garrison. This stockage level must not exceed 7-day operational needs.
