SUBJECT: PERSTEMPO Tracking Guidelines

1. Purpose. To provide information and implementation guidance on the Congressionally mandated PERSTEMPO database initiative within the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault).
2. Facts.
 - a. The FY00 National Defense Authorization Act requires the Army to account for every soldier via PERSTEMPO beginning 1 Oct 00.
 - b. IAW the Deputy Secretary of Defense memorandum, subject above, dated 8 October 2001, the requirement of General and Flag Officers to personally manage PERSTEMPO thresholds is suspended. However, the requirement for units to track and report their soldiers approaching the 182 and 220-day thresholds to ACofS, G1 remains in effect. Collection of such data is required in developing after action reports, replying to queries or accomplishing analyses relating to the scope of operations.
 - c. ACofS, G1 Plans and Operations, retains overall responsibility for PERSTEMPO tracking for the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault). The 101st Soldier Support Battalion (SSB) is responsible for training, or user/administrators may access instructional material at <https://perstempowbt.ahrs.army.mil>.
 - d. PERSTEMPO tracking remains at each battalion/separate company level. User/administrator directly enters soldier data into the HQDA program, creating and updating permanent and temporary AHRI, and managing group PERSTEMPO events. Actual departure and projected return dates must be updated as they occur.
 - e. The requirement for soldiers to provide current Service Member Deployment History Outprocessing Verification remains unchanged.
 - f. PERSTEMPO data is annotated on the soldiers' LES.
